

Knitting Hat Class Supply list

All you need to bring to class on the first night is yourself. ❤️

I will bring your knitting needles and yarn to practice with. I'll go over the different yarn types and the best one to get for your hat.

If you want to get a jump start and buy some yarn before class starts here's what you'll need.

Yarn: Worsted Weight wool, wool blend, or acrylic. 150-200 yards

(It's best not to use cotton yarn when you're just starting out because it's not very forgiving.)

Avoid solid dark colors because it's very hard to make out the stitches when you're just starting out. Acrylic yarns can feel weird to the touch when knitting. Something to think about.

Seattle Yarn in west Seattle is a great knitting shop if you want to shop in person for your yarn close to the ferry.

For online yarn shopping I use yarn.com, etsy for nice hand dyed yarns, and random LYS(local yarn shops).

If your yarn comes in a hank I can wind it into a ball for you.
