

Knitting Sock Class Supply List

We will be knitting top down socks with a heel gusset using double pointed needles.

The first night of class you will need to bring your needles and yarn.

What you'll need:

Needles: Double Pointed set of 5, size 8, 7 inches long.

Optional: Circular needles, 9", size 8.

You can knit the entire sock with the double pointed needles. Knitting with circular needles is sometimes faster. It can be tricky at first with a small diameter because the ends are so close together. If you want, you can use the circular needles and then transfer to double pointed for the heel and toe, this is what I do.

Yarn: Worsted Weight yarn, a soft wool is preferable. **200-350 yards for adult socks** .

Acrylic yarn will work too.

This is the yarn I've used. It's superwash wool so it can be washed in the machine, nice for socks.

Notions: Locking stitch markers

Place Marker

Tapestry needle

The locking stitch markers are used to mark rows as you go, this helps with making both socks the same.

The pattern uses a stretchy cast on, the Twisted German cast on. Here's a link to a how-to video for you to brush up before class if you aren't familiar. I'll walk you through it as well.
